 - In the 2010-2011 school year, staff began evaluating and reviewing curriculum. Staff took time to engage in understanding and evaluating the Explore and Plan test results.
2. Memorial will improve print and digital literacy skills of all students at Memorial. (Year 2)

Goal for 2011-12

In collaboration with North High School, Memorial High School teaching staff will develop, implement, and analyze a minimum of two common, curricular-based assessments per course to facilitate the attainment of post-secondary readiness for at least 80% of students as measured by the assessments developed.

Highlights of the Year

- Our ACT and WKCE scores continue to be above the state average.
- For the 4th consecutive year, Memorial has been named one of the top public high schools in the United States by *Newsweek Magazine*.
- 952 student athletes participated in athletics at Memorial. Seven teams won Big Rivers Conference titles, and the following teams/individual qualified for the WIAA state competition: Boy's and Girl's Tennis, Girl's and Boy's Swim & Dive, Boy's and Girl's Cross Country, Gymnastics, Spiritline, Boy's and Girl's Track and Field, Boy's Soccer, Wrestling, Boy's Hockey, and Boy's and Girl's Golf.
- The following clubs/organizations qualified for state/national levels of competition: DECA, VICA, FCCLA, FBLA, FFA, and Forensics. Many of these organizations received State/National recognition as well.
- Memorial Math League placed 9th out of 80 schools in Wisconsin.
- Several instrumental music students participated in solo ensemble for band and orchestra.
- 60% of Orchestra students received a 1's on solos at WSMA District Solo Ensemble.
- Memorial clubs/organizations continue to serve the Greater Eau Claire community with countless hours of community service and thousands of dollars in monetary donations.
- Memorial Key Club provided over 5,900 hours of community service.
- Memorial's Key Club earned the Golden Club Award.

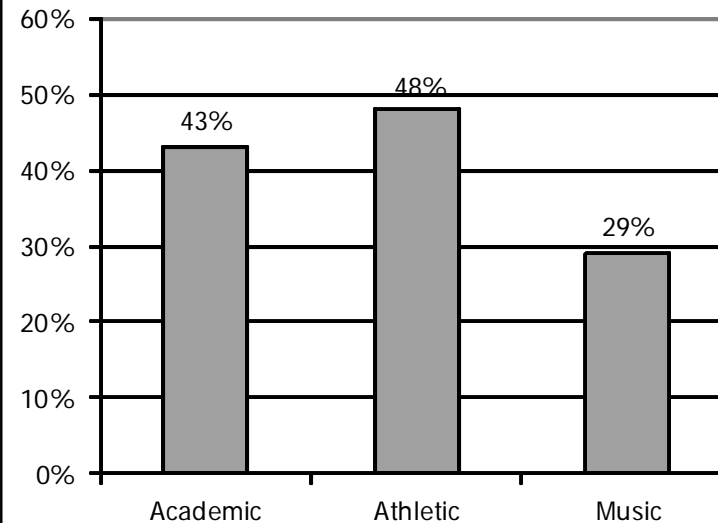

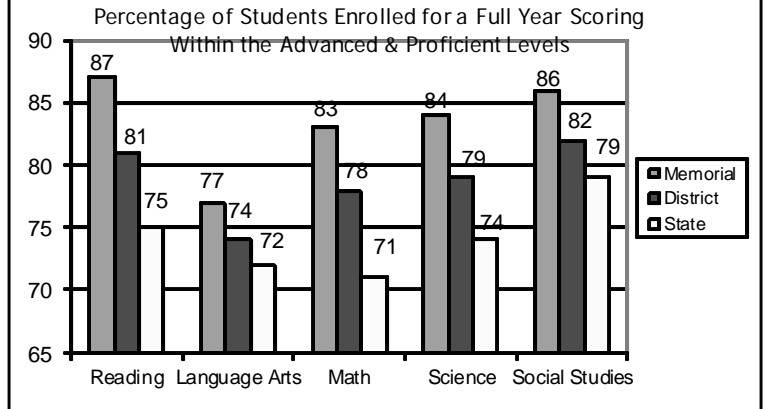

Percentage of Students Involved

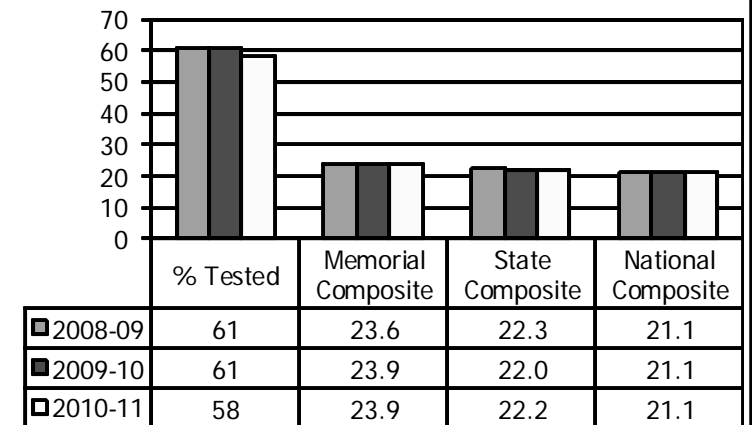


How We Perform
